Dear Bhai Ji:

Your most welcome letter came the other day. I was glad to hear from you. I did not know your Hotel address nor the street address of the Masonic Temple, that is why I asked Mrs. Hanson to deliver the message. She is a very sweet little woman and a loyal friend.

I'm leaving for Denver on the 2nd of August, and my lectures will start there on Sunday, August 13th and run through October 13th, - so when you return eastward I'll be in Denver. If you can stop on your way I'll be glad to share Darshan.

Bhai Ji, you are right, our Indian Humanity possesses the deeper pools of quality which come out in daily conduct: no matter how depraved a Hindu may be, he still has that devotional level that is unsurpassed. It is not a pretense but genuine and spontaneous expression of the beauty of soul. European languages with the exception of French, and particularly the English language, lack the delicacy of structure through which the poetical expressions can permeate, it is not the soul of the people to react to lofty Idealism, but there are plenty of practical lessons we can learn from them. With the matter of fact philosophy of Europeans and the mystical dreams of India, what wonders can be achieved. The seriousness of problems which the extremes of these two states can manifest in one being, without tearing him to pieces.
