Dear Jagat Singh Ji,

Greetings to you! Received your kind letter and got the news. I am o.k. here in every way and all the time pray to Waheguru for your well-being. Dear brother, you have asked me to write strongly to respected father. I cannot dare to take this uncalled for action. You might know that once or twice I made the mistake of opposing him. I continue to repent for that mistake till today. I am still sorry for having made the mistake of hurting Dad's pious soul owing to my stupidity. I take solace thinking that my broad-minded father may have forgiven me. There is no friend better than one's parents. Irrespective of the magnitude of the mistake, th

e father is always forgiving. He always thinks of the well-being of his progeny. So I warn you that you are making a mistake when you do not obey father. Even the witch does not "eat" her sons. Father always advises you with your well-being in his mind. Hopefully, you will accept my request and will attend to father wholeheartedly like virtuous sons. I am surprised that soon after your marriage you have written to me that I should write strongly to Dad. I can never write a strong letter to our religious father who did our up-bringing himself enduring a lot of difficulties, who provided for our education and even arranged your marriage. You are my younger brother. I wish you well. I love you more than kingship of the world. So what I am writing is for your benefit. If a certain instruction from Dad is not acceptable, you can obediently and very humbly submit to him your counter proposal. Dad will not mind it.
